

Municipal Election October 24, 2022

Elections for municipal government are held every four years on the fourth Monday of October. The Legislative Assembly of Ontario legislation (Bill 81, Schedule H), passed in 2006, set the length of terms in office for all municipal elected officials at four years.

The Township of Lucan Biddulph will once again be utilizing the online and telephone voting method similar to the 2014 & 2018 elections.

Nomination Day for candidates will be May 2nd, 2022 and information on how to become a candidate will be available early in 2022.

All election information will be posted on the Township's website.

Who can vote:

Anyone can vote in a municipal election who, on the day of the election, is:

- 18 years of age or older
- a Canadian citizen; and
- either a resident of the municipality or a property owner or tenant or the spouse or same sex partner of an owner or tenant in the municipality during a specified time just before the election.

Who can be a candidate:

- Candidate must be a resident of the municipality or a non-resident owner or tenant of land in the municipality or the spouse of such non-resident owner or tenant;
- a Canadian citizen and at least 18 years old;
- not legally prohibited from voting; and not disqualified by any legislation from holding municipal office.

Huron Shores Area Transit

Get where you want to go with the all-new Huron Shores Area Transit bus service! This affordable bus system is designed to provide residents with affordable transportation options while connecting our local towns and villages to one another. This Transit system is made possible through an Ontario Community Transportation Grant. This grant supports local and intercommunity bus services in areas currently underserved by public transit. The Grand Bend to and from London Route (Green Route) runs seven days a week; this is the route that the Lucan Biddulph community is serviced by. Transit fares vary from \$5.00 - \$20.00 depending on where your destination and arrival locations are. Children aged 4 and under ride for free. The Lucan Biddulph bus stop is located on Main Street in front of the Lucan Community Centre.

Stops include Sobeys Plaza in Grand Bend, Main Street and Ontario Street North, Dashwood Road at Centre Street in Dashwood, Mill Avenue at Bluewater Municipal Building in Zurich, 108 King Street at the Heritage Hall in Hensall, Main Street Exeter at Victoria Street, Sanders Street and Huron Street West, Huron Park on Airport Line at Stephen Township Arena, Lucan on Main Street at the Community Centre & Arena and London on Fanshawe Road and North Centre Road in front of the RBC or London Transit Top #705.

Beginning in 1995 The Lucan and Area Heritage Society has worked tirelessly to preserve and present the history of Lucan and the surrounding area. This includes the story of the infamous Black Donnelly family. This story has continued to fascinate and continues to inspire works of literature and film. Our museum houses the Ray Fazakas collection of Donnelly family artifacts, as well as an expansive section on the history of Lucan-Biddulph. We also have two historic buildings, a barn used by Hearn's Dairy in the region that dates back to the turn of the century, and a log cabin built in the 1860s moved onto the site in the year 2000 which shares a floorplan and construction style with the original Donnelly Homestead.

Sadly, we have had to curtail our programs these past two seasons, but in 2022 we hope to bring back our most popular and successful fundraiser by mounting a brand-new Donnelly Escape Room!



We will be open from May through September and continue to offer services such as the Vigilante Bus Tour, our Donnelly Presentation, and our upcoming Virtual Tours. Our major fundraising gala originally scheduled for the summer of 2020 will now take place June 10th, 2023. So, keep an eye out for more information regarding our 1950s Rock & Roll Extravaganza!

5420 Prince William St., Lucan



Lucan Conservation Area is an eight-acre property adjacent to the Little Ausable River in the McGillivray Ward of North Middlesex. Half of the property is floodplain and the remainder is a rolling upland hardwood forest.

The Little Ausable subwatershed has a high level of stress with respect to water quality. The property, although small, improves subwatershed health.

More Information:


- Horses, motorized vehicles, and bicycles of any kind are NOT permitted in this conservation area.
- Campfires are only permitted in the provided barbecue.
- Hunting and camping are prohibited.





Komoka Provincial Park

Gideon Drive, Komoka



Situated on the western edge of the City of London, the park is a hidden gem offering outstanding views of the Thames River valley. Popular activities at this day-use park include hiking, dog walking, trail running, bird watching, sport fishing and nature photography. Komoka Provincial Park has a vast trail system consisting of coloured trails (orange, yellow, blue) and the White Trail which spans the Thames River and North Thames River from Delaware to St. Mary's. Hiking, mountain biking and horseback riding are permitted on the coloured trails. To preserve features, bicycles and horses are not permitted on the White Trail.

The parking lot at Gideon Dr. and Brigham Rd., as well as the parking lot on Oxford St. will be closed for rehabilitation. A new parking lot has been created at 503 Gideon Dr., east of Brigham Rd., which offers lighting, garbage collection and restroom facilities. This new parking lot allows centralized access to the park and alleviates the problems posed by the former lots. The park boundary has also been expanded to include two provincially acquired parcels. An additional parking lot has been created at 22290 Komoka Rd. to access park lands known locally as "The Ponds."

Morrison Dam Conservation Area

Morrison Dam Conservation Area (MDCA) is located about 20 minutes from Lucan at 71108 Morrison Line, east of Exeter. Get outside and enjoy the well maintained trails that the Morrison Dam Conservation Area has to offer. Morrison Lake (Morrison Reservoir) is one of the area's only inland lakes.

South Huron Trail

The scenic, multi-use South Huron Trail is an eight-kilometre trail with two sections, one in rural South Huron and the other with an urban trailhead in Exeter. This accessible trail links MacNaughton Park in Exeter and Morrison Dam Conservation Area at 71108 Morrison Line, two kilometres east of Exeter.



Main Hall/Gymnasium


- An ideal location for athletic programs, birthday parties, large events, weddings, Stag & Doe's, and fundraisers.
