

Huron Shores Area Transit

Get where you want to go with the all-new Huron Shores Area Transit bus service! This affordable bus system is designed to provide residents with affordable transportation options while connecting our local towns and villages to one another. This Transit system is made possible through an Ontario Community Transportation Grant. This grant supports local and intercommunity bus services in areas currently underserved by public transit. The Grand Bend to and from London Route (Route 2/Green Route) runs seven days a week; this is the route that the Lucan Biddulph community is serviced by. Transit fares vary from \$5.00 - \$20.00 depending on where your destination and arrival locations are. Children aged 4 and under ride for free. The Lucan Biddulph bus stop is located on Main Street in front of the Lucan Biddulph Community Memorial Centre.

Stops include Sobeys Plaza in Grand Bend, Main Street and Ontario Street North, Dashwood Road at Centre Street in Dashwood, Mill Avenue at Bluewater Municipal Building in Zurich, 108 King Street at the Heritage Hall in Hensall, Main Street Exeter at Victoria Street, Sanders Street and Huron Street West, Huron Park on Airport Line at Stephen Township Arena, Lucan on Main Street at the Community Centre & Arena and London on Fanshawe Road and North Centre Road in front of the RBC or London Transit Top #705.

Beginning in 1995 The Lucan and Area Heritage Society has worked tirelessly to preserve and present the history of Lucan and the surrounding area. This includes the story of the infamous Black Donnelly family. This story has continued to fascinate and continues to inspire works of literature and film. Our museum houses the Ray Fazakas collection of Donnelly family artifacts, as well as an expansive section on the history of Lucan-Biddulph. We also have two historic buildings, a barn used by Hearn's Dairy in the region that dates back to the turn of the century, and a log cabin built in the 1860s moved onto the site in the year 2000 which shares a floorplan and construction style with the original Donnelly Homestead.

We will be open from May through September and continue to offer services such as the Vigilante Bus Tour, our Donnelly Presentation, and our upcoming



Virtual Tours. In addition to the Rock & Roll Extravaganza, the Donnelly Museum will be holding a number of other events. February they will be hosting a public paranormal investigation of the museum. Spring will mark the return of the popular Donnelly Escape Room, and winter will bring the revival of the Christmas Home Tour.



Lucan Conservation Area is an eight-acre property adjacent to the Little Ausable River in the McGillivray Ward of North Middlesex. Half of the property is floodplain and the remainder is a rolling upland hardwood forest.

The Little Ausable subwatershed has a high level of stress with respect to water quality. The property, although small, improves subwatershed health.

More Information:

- Horses, motorized vehicles, and bicycles of any kind are NOT permitted in this conservation area.
- Campfires are only permitted in the provided barbecue.
- Hunting and camping are prohibited.



Dorchester Mill Pond Eco Trail

Mill Road, Dorchester



The cluster of flora and fauna at the Mill Pond is a fine example of Carolinian forest right here in Dorchester. Park your car in the large parking lot off of Mill Road. Enjoy a hike around the entire perimeter of the pond along the nature trail. Stroll along natural paths, over wooden walkways, and bridges. Enjoy the panoramic view from the lookout deck on the east side or perhaps see flocks of Canada geese land on the water as you watch from the unique wooden bridge at the south end of the pond.

Evidence of a beaver dam can be seen beside the bridge. The Mill Pond is truly a unique natural area located right in the Village of Dorchester.

The pond itself is tranquil and changes from season to season providing excellent subject matter for photographers. Visitors may wish to simply enjoy the view looking south from the dam reconstructed in 2005, or enjoy a quite walk in the cool shade. The century old pond and dam provide a setting for quiet enjoyment.

The pond and surrounding area offers a diverse collection of flora and fauna. The trees, which include black cherry and white oak, offer a home to many different species of birds. Ground shrubs such as raspberry bushes and dogwood support various mammals including cottontails, raccoons, and white tail deer. The pond itself, which boasts beautiful yellow water lilies, is inhabited by water fowl, turtles, bass and even beavers - a rarity in Southwestern Ontario.

Enjoy conservation areas, trails, nature and recreation both in the Township of Lucan Biddulph and in nearby communities!

In addition to the Lucan Conservation Area (5420 William Street), there are many other nearby conservation areas and trails for you to enjoy. Spend time in nature, enjoy the beautiful scenery, get active, and check out other spaces for habitat appreciation and reflection.

Ausable Bayfield Conservation Authority (ABCA) has nine different local conservation areas.

Morrison Dam Conservation Area

Morrison Dam Conservation Area (MDCA) is located about 20 minutes from Lucan at 71108 Morrison Line, east of Exeter. Get outside and enjoy the well maintained trails that the Morrison Dam Conservation Area has to offer. Morrison Lake (Morrison Reservoir) is one of the area's only inland lakes.

South Huron Trail

The scenic, multi-use South Huron Trail is an eight-kilometre trail with two sections, one in rural South Huron and the other with an urban trailhead in Exeter. This accessible trail links MacNaughton Park in Exeter and Morrison Dam Conservation Area at 71108 Morrison Line, two kilometres east of Exeter.

Trail-Smart Tips

Be sure to know what activities are permitted and what activities are prohibited. There are also conservation rules and 'Tips to Enjoy Your Visit' on our conservation areas pages. Please plan accordingly, wear proper shoes, and always bring a water and snack on your trail trip.

Protecting soil, water, habitat in partnership with you

Tree planting





The Lucan Biddulph Soccer Complex

Soccer has been listed as one of the fastest-growing sports in Canada and the Lucan Minor Soccer Association has seen a dramatic increase in enrolment. The Lucan Minor Soccer Association approached the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee and Council in February of 2019 to discuss solutions for the soccer programs in Lucan Biddulph. Members advised that the Association's needs could no longer be met with the current fields as the growth has increased. In April of 2022, Council opted to invest in a 16.7 acre parcel of land adjacent to the lagoons and Campanale storm management pond to develop a new soccer complex to meet the needs of the growing community. Development on the Lucan Biddulph Soccer Complex was awarded to GHN Infrastructure Inc. The project began in the Spring of 2022 and is presently in the final stages of development.
