Middlesex County Connect

Middlesex County Connect, an inter-community transit service, serves as a vital link that connects our local municipalities to one another and to the hubs of London, Woodstock, and Ingersoll. It caters to the needs of seniors, students, youth, workers, and persons with disabilities, allowing them to easily access amenities in their hometowns as well as neighboring communities.


Middlesex County Connect currently operates two round-trip bus routes on weekdays during peak hours: Route 1: Lucan, Ilderton, Arva, and London Route 2: Woodstock, Ingersoll, Putnam, Dorchester, and London

All buses are wheelchair accessible featuring high-floor ramp access, two dedicated wheelchair spaces, and a wheelchair lift. Buses also have a front-mounted bike rack that can carry up to two bikes. Middlesex County Connect aims to make commuting affordable for all with a \$5 one-way fare, accepting both cash and credit/debit payments on the bus for rider flexibility. Children aged 5 and under, support persons, and veterans ride free of charge.

The user-friendly Blaise Transit app enhances the commuting experience by allowing riders to effortlessly book, pre-pay fare, and track bus arrivals on their smartphones. Even those without access to a mobile device can book trips online using the web app at ride.blaisetransit.com or by calling our call center at 1-888-465-0783. Riders without a smartphone or computer can continue to simply arrive at a Middlesex County Connect bus stop 5 minutes before the scheduled pick-up time and pay on board.

Students can enjoy a discounted 30-day pass priced at \$160 through the app, allowing unlimited rides on all routes within the designated period. Free individual and family bus passes are also available in Lucan, Ilderton, and Dorchester libraries, contributing further to the service's accessibility and affordability.

Middlesex County Connect, funded by the Government of Ontario's Community Transportation Grant Program, will receive provincial funding until March 31, 2025. Voyago is the service provider operating two fixed routes on weekdays, excluding holidays.

Huron Shores Area Transit

Get where you want to go with the Huron Shores Area Transit bus service! This affordable bus system is designed to provide residents with affordable transportation options while connecting our local towns and villages to one another. This Transit system is made possible through an Ontario Community Transportation Grant. This grant supports local and intercommunity bus services in areas currently underserved by public transit. The Grand Bend to and from London Route (Route 2/Green Route) runs seven days a week; this is the route that the Lucan Biddulph community is serviced by. Transit fares vary from \$5.00 - \$20.00 depending on where your destination and arrival locations are. Children aged 4 and under ride for free. The Lucan Biddulph bus stop is located on Main Street in front of the Lucan Biddulph

Community Memorial Centre.

Stops include Sobeys Plaza in Grand Bend, Main Street and Ontario Street North, Dashwood Road at Centre Street in Dashwood, Mill Avenue at Bluewater Municipal Building in Zurich, 108 King Street at the Heritage Hall in Hensall, Main Street Exeter at Victoria Street, Sanders Street and Huron Street West, Huron Park on Airport Line at Stephen Township Arena, Lucan on Main Street at the Community Memorial Centre and London on Fanshawe Road and North Centre Road in front of the RBC or London Transit stop #705.



Beginning in 1995 The Lucan and Area Heritage Society has worked tirelessly to preserve and present the history of Lucan and the surrounding area. This includes the story of the infamous Black Donnelly family. This story has continued to fascinate and continues to inspire works of literature and film. Our museum houses the Ray Fazakas collection of Donnelly family artifacts, as well as an expansive section on the history of Lucan-Biddulph. We also have two historic buildings, a barn used by Hearn's Dairy in the region that dates back to the turn of the century, and a log cabin built in the 1860s moved onto the site in the year 2000 which shares a floorplan and construction style with the original Donnelly Homestead.

We will be open from May through September and continue to offer services such as the Vigilante Bus Tour, our Donnelly Presentation, and our upcoming Virtual Tours. Lucan Heritage will be hosting another fundraiser gala! The 50's Rock & Roll Extravaganza to be held at the Lucan Biddulph Community Memorial Centre on Saturday, June 8th, 2024. A 1950's themed gala in the same vein as our popular Titanic Ball of 2012 and our Gangster Gala of 2015, we will be hosting a night of fun fun fun with live music, Lucan's own Elvis, a \$1,000 jiving competition, great food, dancing, and much more! 

Lucan Conservation Area is an eight-acre property adjacent to the Little Ausable River in the McGillivray Ward of North Middlesex. Half of the property is floodplain and the remainder is a rolling upland hardwood forest.

The Little Ausable subwatershed has a high level of stress with respect to water quality. The property, although small, improves subwatershed health.

More Information:

- Horses, motorized vehicles, and bicycles of any kind are NOT permitted in this conservation area.
- Hunting and camping are prohibited.

Ausable Bayfield Conservation Projects

With funding from the Government of Canada – Fisheries and Oceans Canada – Habitat Stewardship Program for Species at Risk we have worked with the community extensively at Campanale Pond, Ausable Fields and other locations around the municipality. This work improves stormwater management, species and habitat monitoring for Black Redhorse, and habitat improvement with a focus on the Little Ausable River.

The Little Ausable River is historical habitat for the Black Redhorse, a threatened fish species (SARA). Improving wetlands, increasing native habitats and monitoring this species are a few ways our community can help all the species at risk in our area.

Wetland Importance

Wetlands act as a natural filter for our Earth. Re-establishing them can help to reduce sediment and unnecessary nutrients from entering our waterways while also providing essential habitat for a variety of species.

Rain Gardens

Rain gardens are designed to hold and filter rain water and built to help water return to and seep into the soil. This recharges streams and groundwater. We planted more than 1,343 native plants in 2022-2023.

Pollinator Gardens

Pollinator gardens are built to attract local pollinators: butterflies, beetles, bees, hummingbirds. Plants with native species provide food and habitat and also help in the local food chains and local agriculture.





Community Participation

Community participation in the work done by ABCA is essential to ensure long-term partnerships, growth and commitments. Whether it is students from our local schools, community members or group members from local nonprofits such as Scouts or even our local libraries. Each group is crucial to the sustainability of these plantings and programs.

More than 3,500 native trees were planted in The Township of Lucan Biddulph in the year with the municipality planting approximately 100 trees per year in natural areas and parks.








The Lucan Fitness Alliance
