

Marriage Licenses

The Township of Lucan Biddulph issues Marriage Licenses at a cost of \$125 (cash, cheque or debit). Please contact the office to schedule an appointment prior, or if you wish to do a walk-in appointment, please allow at least one day for the license to be ready for pick up.

Commissioner of Oaths

The Township of Lucan Biddulph offers Commissioner of Oaths services at a cost of \$10 for residents of Lucan Biddulph and \$20 for non-residents. Please contact the office to schedule an appointment prior to your visit.

Burn Permits

If you require a burn permit, please refer to and read our Open Air Burning By-Law (No. 23-2017). You can locate the By-Law and submit your burn permit request on our website under section: Municipal Services – Fire Services.

Garbage & Recycling

Black Waste Bins & residential Blue Recycling Bins are picked up weekly on Fridays. NEW: Starting Tues. Jan. 6, 2026 - Red ICI Recycling Bins are picked up bi-weekly on Tuesdays. ICI = Industrial, Commercial, and Institutional properties. Please ensure bins are placed at the curb/roadside by 7 am. Only BRA wheelie bins allowed. Any changes to bin sizes or damage repairs, please contact Bluewater Recycling at 519-228-6678 or bra.org.

Green Waste Bins

Green waste bins will be placed at the Public Works – Facility at 34363 Saintsbury Line, and the Granton Park for "clean yard waste." Clean yard waste includes; grass, leaves, small brush (less than 6" diameter), and garden trim.

These containers will be available at the Public Works Facility during Spring, Summer and Fall; and at Granton Park during Spring and Fall.



Lucan Biddulph Council:

The Township of Lucan Biddulph consists of one Mayor, one Deputy Mayor and 3 Councillors that are elected to represent each of the Township's three Wards for a period of 4 years. A candidate can run for office in the ward of their choice. You do not have to live in the same ward you are running in. However, you do have to vote from the address at which you reside.

Municipal elections are about helping shape the future of your community. The people you vote for work together to make decisions on local issues and share your voice at the Council table. By voting, you're choosing representatives who will listen to your concerns, set priorities for the Township, and make sure Lucan Biddulph continues to be a safe, welcoming, and growing place to live. Your vote is one of the most direct ways to take part in local democracy and to help build a better Lucan Biddulph for everyone.

Voters:

Elections Ontario maintains the Permanent Register of Electors for Ontario. Check your information by visiting RegisterToVote.ca or call 1-866-242-3025.

You can update your school support designation through MPAC's Online School Support Tool. Changes for the 2026 Municipal Election must be submitted before June 1, 2026. To learn more about school support, visit the MPAC website.

In order to be **eligible to vote**, you must meet the Qualifications of Electors as listed in the Municipal Elections Act, 1996, s.17(2)

A person is entitled to be an elector at an election held in a local municipality if, on voting day, he or she,

- resides in the local municipality or is the owner or tenant of land there, or is the spouse of such owner or tenant;
- is a Canadian citizen;
- is at least 18 years old; and
- is not prohibited from voting under subsection (3) or otherwise by law.

Candidates:

Eligible candidates for municipal elections must be:

- A Canadian citizen and at least 18 years old
- A resident of the municipality, a non-resident owner or tenant of land in the municipality or the spouse of such non-resident owner or tenant
- Not legally prohibited from voting; and not disqualified by any legislation from holding municipal office.

Candidates are also required to pay a fee of \$100 (\$200 for head of council) and those running in municipalities with more than 4,000 electors are also required to obtain 25 endorsement signatures when they submit their nomination (Lucan Biddulph is requiring endorsement signatures).

The 2026 Lucan Biddulph Municipal Election will be once again be conducted through electronic and telephone voting.

AREA TRANSIT

Middlesex County Connect is an inter-community public transit service that provides connections between local municipalities within Middlesex County and links them to the hubs of London, Sarnia, St. Thomas, Southwold, Woodstock, and Ingersoll.

The service enables residents to access post-secondary institutions, employment, medical appointments, social programs, grocery stores, and to visit friends and family. It also connects with other inter-community and local transit systems, including London Transit (LTC), Railway City Transit (RCT), Sarnia Transit, and Woodstock Transit. Please note that connections are not free and must be paid for separately.

Middlesex County Connect buses operate on fixed routes and schedules. The current round-trip routes are:

- Route 1: Lucan, Ilderton, Arva, London (weekdays only)
- Route 2: Woodstock, Ingersoll, Putnam, Dorchester, London (weekdays only)
- Route 3: Dorchester, London, St. Thomas, Southwold (Monday–Saturday)
- Route 4: London, Komoka, Mt. Brydges, Strathroy, Sarnia (Monday–Sunday)

All buses are wheelchair accessible, featuring high-floor ramp access, two dedicated wheelchair spaces, and a wheelchair lift. Each bus is also equipped with a front-mounted bike rack that accommodates up to two bikes. Children aged 5 and under, support persons, and veterans ride free of charge.

The following features are currently available on Routes 1, 2, and 3 and will be made available on Route 4 in early 2026. Please check middlesex.ca/ct for updates. These features include:


- Acceptance of credit/debit payments on board
- The Blaise Transit app, allowing riders to book trips, pre-pay fares, and track bus arrivals via smartphone
- Online trip booking at ride.blaisetransit.com
- Discounted 30-day student pass (\$160), providing unlimited rides for the duration of the pass
- Free individual and family bus passes available at libraries in Lucan, Ilderton, and Dorchester

Passengers can ride any Middlesex County Connect bus and pay cash (exact change) on board without pre-booking. However, seats are limited, and passengers who have not pre-booked may not be guaranteed a seat. For trip booking or customer service on any route, call 1-888-465-0783.

Service and routes may change. Please visit middlesex.ca/ct for the most up-to-date information.

Middlesex County Connect is funded through the provincial Ontario Transit Investment Fund (OTIF) program and by Middlesex County along with its municipal partners, including the City of London, the City of St. Thomas, and the City of Sarnia.

LUCAN AREA HERITAGE / DONNELLY MUSEUM

Beginning in 1995 The Lucan and Area Heritage Society has worked tirelessly to preserve and present the history of Lucan and the surrounding area. This includes the story of the infamous Black Donnelly family. This story has continued to fascinate and continues to inspire works of literature and film. Our museum houses the Ray Fazakas collection of Donnelly family artifacts, as well as an expansive section on the history of Lucan-Biddulph. We also have two historic buildings, a barn used by Hearn's Dairy in the region that dates back to the turn of the century, and a log cabin built in the 1860s moved onto the site in the year 2000 which shares a floorplan and construction style with the original Donnelly Homestead.

We will be open for public hours May through September, Wednesday through Sunday 11 am to 4 pm. In addition to Museum visits, we also offer the Vigilante Bus Tour and our Donnelly and Wilberforce presentations where we bring the history to you! This season we will open our 360 virtual visit to the Donnelly Homestead property. We will continue to host special events, including our monthly Bingo Nights held at the Lucan Biddulph Community Memorial Centre the third Wednesday of every month at 7 pm. On Saturday, March 28th, we will be holding a live charity auction, to keep an eye on our website and social media for details as they come!

2026 will see the launch of the Lucan Biddulph Legacy project. This project will seek to collect stories, interviews, photographs, and other media and ephemera from individuals throughout the township and beyond to help achieve a more thorough understanding of our rich history.

As we continue to work at preserving the history of Lucan Biddulph, we are grateful for the continued support from the community. We continue to invite individuals to join the Lucan and Area Heritage Society as volunteers! We welcome a wide variety of skills and perspectives to help make sure that our museum continues to thrive and represent our great community.



Lucan Conservation Area is an eight-acre property adjacent to the Little Ausable River in the McGillivray Ward of North Middlesex. Half of the property is floodplain and the remainder is a rolling upland hardwood forest.

The Little Ausable subwatershed has a high level of stress with respect to water quality. The property, although small, improves subwatershed health.

More Information:



